

The *CHELSEA FLOWER SHOW & ENGLISH GARDENS Tour!*

May 22 – May 29, 2010

“Beautiful English Gardens ... Gorgeous Flowers ... Lovely Parks & Countryside ... All these are yours to behold, as well as the remarkable Chelsea Flower Show.”



1st Day: Board plane for your transatlantic flight to England.

2nd Day: Arriving in London we meet our escort, transfer to Brighton, in West Sussex and check into our hotel where we have accommodations for the next 3 evenings. We'll take a mini-tour of the popular seaside town seeing the colorful labyrinth of alleys known as the Lane District, Brighton Place, Fabrica – the Regency era church turned art gallery and the famous Brighton Pier. A welcome reception precedes a delicious dinner. (D)

3rd Day: A visit to Leonardslee Lakes & Gardens is one of today's highlights. Fantastic at any time of year, but especially in the Spring, Leonardslee's display of rhododendrons, azaleas, woodlands, lakes and streams is sure to delight you. And its famous Doll House exhibition is absolutely amazing. Afternoon "High Tea" at a private estate overlooking magnificent gardens tops off a lovely – and colorful – day. (B)

4th Day: Today begins with a visit to the remarkable Royal Pavilion, a simple farm that, over 35 years, was transformed into a spectacular Palace that mixes Asian exoticism with English eccentricity. In the afternoon the wondrous sights continue as we visit the award winning Borde Hill Gardens, where their annual "Sculpture in the Garden" exhibition will be in full swing. (B)

5th Day: We take the short trip to visit the imposing Arundle Castle, seat of the Dukes of Norfolk. Set on 40 acres of sweeping grounds and gardens, you'll learn about the 1,000 years of history of this great 11th century castle. Then it's on to London, where we have accommodations for the next 3 nights. (B,D)



6th Day: We spend the day at the 2010 Chelsea Flower Show. The most famous garden event in the world, the CFS – which is sponsored by the Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) – has been held in London since 1888. Its Show Gardens are created by leading international dazzle visitors with displays of color from the world's finest plant collections. The Gardening Matters Marquee is hosted by gardening experts who discuss all aspects of gardening and enable the visitor to pose questions and discuss techniques, both old and new. And there's more ... (B)

7th Day: Be prepared for another glorious day as we visit the magnificent Kew Gardens, one of England's most historic gardens. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Kew is a world leader in global plant science and conservation. It's unique collection of buildings, gardens and temples, many of which date back to the period of royal ownership of the gardens in the 18th century – from the Prince of Wales

Conservatory to the Bonsai House, Waterlily House, Rose Pergola, Japanese Gateway and Temple of Aeolus - are a sight to behold. (B,D)

8th Day: We transfer to the airport for our flight home. (B)

Tour package includes round trip airfare, accommodations for 6 evenings (3 in Brighton, 3 in London), breakfast each morning, 3 dinners, gratuities for the meals, sightseeing, admissions, the services of a professional tour escort, taxes, transfers and baggage handling in England.
